4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. This Act shall be known as Jenifer's Law.
6	SECTION 2. Subtitle B, Title 3, Occupations Code, is
7	amended by adding Chapter 172 to read as follows:
8	CHAPTER 172. PROVISION OF ELECTIVE INTRAVENOUS THERAPY
9	SUBCHAPTER A. GENERAL PROVISIONS
10	Sec. 172.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
11	(1) "Advanced practice registered nurse" has the
12	meaning assigned by Section 301.152.
13	(2) "Elective intravenous therapy" means a procedure:
14	(A) to administer fluids, nutrients,
15	medications, or blood directly into a patient's bloodstream through
16	a vein;
17	(B) that is sought by the patient to alleviate
18	symptoms of temporary discomfort or improve temporary wellness; and
19	(C) that is not administered in:
20	(i) a physician's office;
21	(ii) a health facility licensed under
22	Subtitle B, Title 4, Health and Safety Code;
23	(iii) a mental hospital licensed under
24	Chapter 577, Health and Safety Code; or

- 1 (iv) a hospital maintained or operated by 2 this state.
- 3 (3) "Physician assistant" means a person who holds a
- 4 license issued under Chapter 204.
- 5 (4) "Registered nurse" means a person licensed by the

- 8 Sec. 172.051. DELEGATION OF PRESCRIBING OR ORDERING
- 9 <u>ELECTIVE INTRAVENOUS THERAPY</u>. (a) A physician may delegate the act
- 10 of prescribing or ordering elective intravenous therapy to:
- 11 (1) a physician assistant acting under adequate
- 12 physician supervision; or

- 15 (b) A physician may delegate the act of administering

- 5 SECTION 3. The changes in law made by this Act apply to the
- 6 performance of a medical act on or after the effective date of this
- 7 Act under a physician's delegation, regardless of:
- 8 (1) the manner in which the delegation is made; and
- 9 (2) whether the delegation is made before, on, or
- 10 after the effective date of this Act.
- 11 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
